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IV. PROGRAM/CURRICULUM

A. GOOD NEWS IN OUR SCHOOLS

Kindergarten

The kindergarten students had their eyes glued to the book, *Little Panda, by Joanne Ryder*. They were amazed to learn about the growth and development of Hua Mei, the baby panda that was born at the San Diego Zoo in California. They figured out quickly that it is important to read the captions to learn all that the author is trying to say. Thanks to the use of our Mimio projectors, students were able to observe the pandas that reside at the San Diego Zoo today. They enjoyed the combination of text and observation to gain information about pandas. They were motivated to put their new- found knowledge on paper in the form of illustrations and words.

First Grade

In the next language arts unit, first grade will be talking a lot about change. In class, they will be creating a timeline. Children will be asked to choose 5 photos that show changes that have happened in their life. They will glue the pictures in sequential order and write a piece to describe what is happening in the photo.

Second Grade

Second grade is working on another research project. They will be researching Turtles and Beavers. It will correlate with the Language Arts unit, Working Together, and Folktale, Turtle's Race with Beaver. The students will be using the Stevenson School Webpage for information, as well as books selected by the second grade teachers from their hometown libraries. The projects will be presented in poster form and their final drafts will be completed during Mrs. Perrone computer classes.

Third Grade

Third grade's Flat Stanley's have been mailed to family and friends worldwide. Students anxiously anticipate finding out the adventures their Flat Stanley will be experiencing in his travels.

Fourth Grade

Students are grasping writing justifications using textual evidence in science, connecting previously learned material about animal adaptation, and applying that to their fossils studies.

Sixth Grade

On January 13, Mr. Freda and Ms. Griffin (guests from ADP), presented a program about the importance of one¢s activities on the Internet. The program, õDigital Footprintsö featured a video and question and answer session.

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The International Day project involves research and a presentation experience while learning about countries around the world. This project will be completed during the Unified Arts period for the next marking period or so.

Fifth and Sixth grade music students went to West Essex on January 13 for the õBuddy Dayö program. It gives our students a chance to practice and perform with students from the consortium and the West Essex Middle School.

Art

A new mural of the Churchill School mascot, a bulldog, designed by the district art teacher, Ms. Cecere, now adorns the wall in the gymnasium.

Reading/Writing

All of the language arts teachers have received training on the new writing program called õEmpowering Writersö. The concepts and lessons will be introduced to our students in the coming weeks.
