A. GOOD NEWS IN OUR SCHOOLS

Churchill School

• <u>School-Wide</u>

Students at Churchill improved their lexile scores by the following amount, as of the halfway marker for the school yearí 4th grade ó average of 92 lexile points 5th grade ó average of 85 lexile points

 6^{th} grade ó average of 79 lexile points

According to ACHIEVE 3000, the expected growth for a normal FULL year, in grades 4-6 is 100 lexile points. The numbers posted are for one HALF year. Great job students and teachers at Churchill, using Achieve 3000 for informational reading.

Students at Churchill participated in the schooløs reading incentive program producing about 56,000 minutes of reading in two weeks of the month-long initiative.

• Grade 6

Grade 6 students tested at West Essex School, on February 5, in order to continue their transition towards West Essex in September. The students were complimented for their behavior and work at West Essex.

Stevenson School

- At the January faculty meeting, grade level teams presented on instructional changes made during the first half of the year in math and Language Arts. Topics included: ongoing common core alignment, strides made to increase academic rigor, cross-curriculum teaching and our increased effort to infuse technology into the curriculum.
- School Report Cards were released by the State of New Jersey. Stevenson rated very high when compared to schools across the state in academic performance and very high when compared to its peer schools in academic performance. College and career readiness scores were average to lagging (Please note: the sole measure of college and career readiness at the elementary level is student attendance).

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• In order to get her students more excited about reading, Ms. Tirrell invited her second graders to join her one evening at the Fairfield Public Library. She arranged a "private tour" and "book preview" with the Children's Librarian, Jaime O'Donnell. On January 29 from 5:30-6:30, Ms. O'Donnell met Ms. Tirrell and her students. She read aloud the first chapter from the newly released the book from *The Magic Tree House* series and showed them where as the kids put it, "all the good books are". Ms. Tirrell is proud to report that thirteen of her seventeen students attended the event. Almost all checked out new books that evening!
