Churchill School

- The fourth grade is excited to start their next adventure at Churchill. Students have been enjoying the new school and love being Churchill Bulldogs. Back to School Night was a huge success. They also learned about different types of energy, including kinetic and potential, by using cups to code and see how energy was involved. - Fifth grade science students were extremely excited to conduct their first of many STEAM experiments.
- The 6th grade students are getting into the swing of "middle school" by mastering their lockers, learning the rhythm of changing classes every period, and getting to know each other and all of their teachers. This group of students are already showing everyone that they are ready to be the leaders of Churchill!

Stevenson School

- Kindergarten is off to a great start! The children have been busy learning about their new school and daily routines. They were very excited to complete the annual Back To School Night project, which is always a huge hit with the parents. The students made self-portraits and brought in a favorite t-shirt to decorate their table seats. A highlight the following morning was reading aloud the notes that the parents left behind.
- First graders have learned the school rules and expectations of Stevenson School and discussed "The Golden Rule," while reading through the NEW Social Studies program. The phonics program, Fundations, is off to a great start as well, with the students practicing their letters, sounds, and letter formation. In writing, the students are composing sentences with proper capitalization and punctuation.

- Second graders have been eagerly learning their new classroom routines. They have created Acrostic name poems and several "All About Me" activities. Each child brought in a "Me" bag filled with pictures and objects that describe them. The students are having fun getting to know one another and are off to a great start this year!
- Third grade students started the year with an author study of Kate DiCamillo and are already more than halfway through their first novel, <u>The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane</u>. Students are learning lots of literary techniques and are loving going on a journey with their friend, Edward. To begin their writing this year, students are decorating their writing journal with pictures of family and friends and things that are of interest to them. We all hope this will motivate our young writers to do some amazing writing this year. Looking forward to a great year.
