### 2014-15 School Budget Highlights

- 1) This is a reallocation budget.
- 2) State Aid still at 1/2 of 09-10 level (\$300K vs. \$600K)
  3) Local Tax Levy Increase at allowable 2%

## Tax Base Analysis

Total Ratable Base 2013: \$2,648,223,100 2014: \$2,622,319,100 (\$25,904,000) Lost Ratables: This loss contributed \$17 to the \$53 increase  $(4/10^{\text{th}} \text{ of a penny})$ . Without the loss, the levy would have gone up only 1.6%, or \$36 on the average home.
